

Updates from Northumberland County

May 12 - 23, 2025

- Monthly Business Survey launches to support neighbourhood vitality around 310 Division Street: Northumberland County has launched a new monthly online survey to gather feedback from businesses within 500 meters of the 310 Division Street, Cobourg shelter. The survey aims to better understand the impact of shelter services on the business sector and assess measures to support both community well-being and economic vitality. Survey results will be reported monthly to the County's Social Services Standing Committee. The first survey period concluded May 11, reflecting on experiences from April. - Community Recycling Centres to require proof of local address: Starting July 2, residents and businesses will be required to show proof of a Northumberland County address when bringing materials to any of the County's Community Recycling Centres (CRCs). By ensuring that CRCs are only used for waste generated within Northumberland, we will help preserve this critical infrastructure for local use further into the future. To confirm eligibility, acceptable documents will include a driver's license, utility bill, tax bill, lease agreement, company letterhead or signed contract. - Fuel your small business expansion with a \$3,500 micro grant from the BECN: The Business Entrepreneurship Centre Northumberland (BECN) is now accepting applications for its Starter Company Growth Program – a unique opportunity for business owners to receive a free micro grant to invest into their business, plus exclusive access to expert training, mentorship, and one-on-one business support. The Starter Company Growth Program, supported by the Province of Ontario, supports eligible entrepreneurs looking to build their small business. Business owners must submit their applications online by June 2, 2025.
